

masquerade	a party or dance of persons wearing masks and other disguises with elegant, historical, or fantastic costumes; to pretend to be someone you are not; a costume or disguise/a false face
renaissance, Renaissance	a renewal/rebirth of life, interest, or learning; the activity, spirit, or time of the great revival of art, literature, and learning in Europe (14th - 17th century) marking the transition from the medieval to the modern world
deferred	postponed or delayed
discriminate	to make a clear distinction for or against a person/thing based on the group, class, or category to which the person/thing belongs rather than based on actual merit; to show partiality; to note or observe a difference
brutality	savage physical violence; great cruelty
fatality	a disaster resulting in death; a death resulting from such an occurrence
dutifully	with a sense of duty, obligation, or respect
confining	limiting
adrift	wandering aimlessly, without direction
entwine	to interweave; to twist together
